Lalumier School Community Garden







Lalumier Elementary garden faced challenges over the summer with water flooding and a lack of volunteers. Despite those challenges, and with the help of Mt. Zions food pantry's managers, Pastor and Mrs. Bowden, the garden did not fail to provide produce to the community. With an abundance of tomatoes, Okra, and Zucchini, the harvested produce was donated to the local food pantry, where community members could utilize it to make healthy meals. By the end of October, at the end of the gardening season, the University of Illinois Extension hosted a garden work day where a group of 4-H Tuscan teens got involved.
