Summary of Neighbor to Neighbor Fall Festival Pop-Up Event

October 22, 2022 11:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m.

A walk audit was conducted in the morning before the Fall Festival. A summary of the walk audit can be found in a separate document.

Visual Preference Survey Summary:

Respondents were asked to give their input on bicycle and pedestrian facilities at an engagement activity with stickers at the N2N Fall Festival 2022. Most of the respondents prefer sidewalks, sidewalks in their neighborhood, and protected bike lanes. Some prefer unprotected bike lanes and sidewalks Downtown, but no one prefers to ride their bicycle with traffic. Respondents commented that Washington Park needs more sidewalks since it's a fun and exciting way to connect. When crossing the street, most respondents prefer textured crosswalks over parallel line crosswalks, and ladder crosswalks. Also, most respondents prefer pedestrian crossing signage on the side of the road instead of center of the road or over the road. When it comes to traffic calming facilities most respondents prefer roundabouts, speed bumps/humps, and curb extensions. Other options were side islands, narrow lanes, and reduced turn radius.

1. Would walk on sidewalks (17 votes)
2. Would walk on sidewalks in neighborhood (16 votes)
3. Would ride in a protected lane (14 votes)
4. Would walk on sidewalks Downtown (7 votes)
5. Would ride in a bike lane (4 votes)
6. Would ride with traffic (0 votes)

Washington Park Barriers:

Respondents were asked to give their input on barriers to walking and biking at an engagement activity with stickers at the N2N Fall Festival 2022. Intersections at or near IL State Route 111 seemed to be the biggest barrier to many of the respondents.

Top areas of concern:

- Bunkum Rd & IL State Route 111 intersection

- St. Clair Ave & IL State Route 111 intersection
- Bunkum Rd & 50th St intersection
- 62nd St & Park Dr intersection

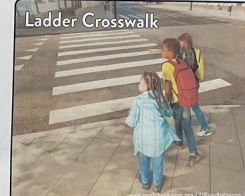

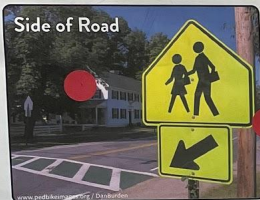

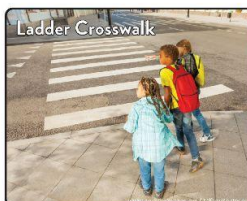
